



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/153

**Review of measures relating to
Consumer pineapple
exported to Australia from the Kingdom of Thailand
Extension of time granted to issue the
Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report for
Review No. 478**

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 18 June 2018, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures relating to certain consumer pineapple (the goods) exported to Australia from the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2018/101 (the initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the review would be placed on the public record by 8 October 2018. The initiation notice advised that the SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the relevant Minister.

The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the relevant Minister would be made in a final report on or before 20 November 2018.

The Commission received cooperation in relation to this review from multiple exporters. Further time is required by the Commission to verify information received from exporters in relation to the review. Accordingly, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission¹, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) in relation to the review.

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,² extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister in relation to the review.

The SEF for the review will now be placed on the public record no later than 2 November 2018. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister for the review will now be made in a report due on or before 20 December 2018.
