



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/199

Review of measures relating to Consumer pineapple exported to Australia from the Kingdom of Thailand Extension of time granted to provide the Final Report for Review No. 478

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 18 June 2018, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures relating to certain consumer pineapple (the goods) exported to Australia from the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2018/101 (the initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the relevant Minister would be made in a final report on or before 20 November 2018.

On 27 September 2018, the Commissioner published ADN No. 2018/153, advising interested parties that the deadline to provide the final report to relevant Minister for the review had been extended until 20 December 2018.

Due to high operational demands, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission¹, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) in relation to the review.

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,² extended the deadline to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister in relation to the review.

A recommendation to the Minister for the review will now be made in a report due on
