



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/157

Aluminium extrusions

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report

in relation to Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No 482

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 12 July 2018, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice, in respect of aluminium extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) as they affect exporters of those goods generally.

A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2018/111 (initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on or before 30 October 2018. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Assistant Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 14 December 2018.

Due to the number of exporters cooperating with the review and the complexity of this matter, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.¹

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,²

extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation.

The SEF will now be placed on the public record on or before **13 January 2019**.³ Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **27 February 2019**.
