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## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2019/40**

### **Wire Rope**

### **Exported to Australia from the Republic of South Africa**

### **Anti-Circumvention Inquiry 483 Slight modification of goods**

### **Extension of time granted to issue *Final Report No 483***

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

On 6 July 2018 Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, (the Commissioner) published a notice (initiation notice) indicating that an anti-circumvention inquiry was to be conducted in relation to wire rope exported to Australia from the Republic of South Africa.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No 2018/105 at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

The initiation notice stated that:

- a statement of essential facts (SEF) for the inquiry would be placed on the public record by 24 October 2018 or such later date as allowed; and
- a recommendation to the Minister would be made in a report on or before 8 December 2018 or such later date as allowed.

The Commissioner extended the due date to publish the SEF and provide the final report to the Minister on two occasions.<sup>1</sup> The SEF was placed on the public record on 11 February 2019.

On 18 March 2019 and 19 March 2019 the Commission published certain attachments to the SEF. In these circumstances I allow interested parties a further 20 days from the publication of the most recent attachment to the SEF to provide further submissions. Any further submission should now be received by no later than **8 April 2019**. The Commissioner is not obliged to have regard to any submission made in response to the SEF received after this date if to do so would, in the opinion of the Commissioner, prevent the timely preparation of the final report to the Minister.

The Commissioner has extended the deadline to provide his report and recommendation to the Minister to allow for any further submissions and for the Commission to address issues raised in any such submissions.<sup>2</sup> The Commissioner's report and recommendation to the Minister will now be made on or before **10 May 2019**.
