## Anti-Circumvention Inquiry 483 Slight modification of goods

#### Extension of time granted to issue Final Report No 483

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 6 July 2018 Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, (the Commissioner) published a notice (initiation notice) indicating that an anti-circumvention inquiry was to be conducted in relation to wire rope exported to Australia from the Republic of South Africa.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No 2018/105 at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice stated that:

- a statement of essential facts (SEF) for the inquiry would be placed on the public record by 24 October 2018 or such later date as allowed; and
- a recommendation to the Minister would be made in a report on or before
  8 December 2018 or such later date as allowed.

The Commissioner extended the due date to publish the SEF and provide the final report to the Minister on two occasions.<sup>1</sup> The SEF was placed on the public record on 11 February 2019.

Following this, the Commissioner allowed interested parties until 8 April 2019 to provide further submissions and extended the due date to provide the report and recommendation to the Minister to 10 May 2019.<sup>2</sup>

The Commission has received further submissions in response to the SEF. As a result, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager of Investigations, consider that further time is required to address these submissions and requested an extension of time under subsection 269ZHI(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* to the deadline for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.

The Commissioner has further extended the deadline to provide his report and recommendation to the Minister.<sup>3</sup> The Commissioner's report and recommendation to the Minister will now be made on or before **31 May 2019**.
