Exported from China and Korea

File Note - Extension of time for Questionnaire responses

On 16 July 2018, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) notified exporters of wind towers exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Korea (subject to the relevant anti-dumping notice) that questionnaire responses in relation to this continuation inquiry were due by no later than 22 August 2018.

The Commission has received requests for extensions of time to the due date from certain exporters within the legislated period, who have communicated their intent to cooperate with the inquiry. Due consideration has been given to the extension requests by a General Manager of the Commission, having regard to the exporters' individual circumstances and the *Customs (Extensions of Time and Non-cooperation) Direction 2015*.¹

The following table summarises the extensions of time given in relation to individual exporters and provides a summary of the revised due dates:
