**Subject: Continuation Review 488 – Prepared or preserved tomatoes exported to Australia from Italy by all exporters other than Feger di Gerardo Ferraioli S.p.A. and La Doria S.p.A. – Mutti SpA – Verification Report**

On 16 July 2018, the Anti-Dumping Commission initiated a continuation review of the antidumping measures applicable to certain prepared or preserved tomatoes ('PPTs') exported to Australia from Italy by all exporters other than Feger di Gerardo Ferraioli S.p.A. and La Doria S.p.A. In light of the very large number of Italian exporters of PPTs, the Anti-Dumping Commission decided to select a sample of five exporters for the purpose of the investigation. These five exporters, including our client Mutti SpA ('Mutti'), are entitled to have an individual dumping margin established by the Anti-Dumping Commission.

Based on the information contained in the questionnaire response, as verified during the on-site visit, the Anti-Dumping Commission calculated a **dumping margin of -1.3%** (negative) for Mutti. It follows that during the investigation period the PPTs exported by Mutti were not dumped. Therefore, irrespective of the Anti-Dumping

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Commission's general decision regarding whether or not to recommend the continuation of the antidumping measures applicable to PPTs exported from Italy, such measures should in any case be terminated *vis-à-vis* Mutti.

In light of the foregoing, the Anti-Dumping Commission is respectfully requested to **recommend the Minister to revoke the antidumping measures in relation to Mutti SpA as provided for by Section 269ZHF(1)(a)(ii) of the Act .**
