Notice for longer period for the declaration of the Minister for Industry,
Science and Technology

Customs Act 1901 - Public notice under subsection 269ZHG(1C)

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed an inquiry concerning whether to continue the anti-dumping measures applying to certain Prepared or Preserved Tomatoes exported to Australia from Italy.

Copies of the application and various submissions made in relation to the investigation are available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The Commissioner provided his final report and recommendations to me on 12 March 2019. Subsection 269ZHG(1B)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) requires the relevant Minister to make their declaration on the outcome of this investigation within 30 days after receiving the Commissioner's report, that is, by **11 April 2019**.

Where there are special circumstances that prevent the declaration being made within that period, subsection 269ZHG(1B)(b) of the Act provides that the declaration may be within such longer period, ending before the specified expiry day, as the Minister considers appropriate.

I consider there are special circumstances and that it is appropriate under subsection 269ZHG(1B) of the Act to extend the period for making my declaration for a further **4 days** to **15 April 2019** in order to properly consider the Commissioner's final report and recommendations.
