

ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2019/43

Steel Reinforcing Bar

Exported from the Republic of Korea and Taiwan

(with the exception of Power Steel Co. Ltd)

Extension of time granted to issue the Final Report to the Minister

in relation to Reviews of Anti-Dumping Measures No.

486 and 489

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 1 August 2018, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of antidumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice, in respect of steel reinforcing bar (the goods) exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea and Taiwan (with the exception of Power Steel Co. Ltd) as they affect exporters of those goods generally.

A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2018/112 (initiation notice).¹ The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>.

The initiation notice advised that a recommendation to the Minister would be made in a final report on or before 3 January 2019. The Commissioner previously extended this deadline until 3 April 2019 as advised in ADN No. 2018/171.²

Due to the complexity of submissions received following publication of the Statement of Essential Facts (SEF), I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission,³ requested a further extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.⁴

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Customs Act 1901,
