Exported to Australia from Malaysia by Alumac Industries Sdn Bhd

Notice for longer period for the declaration of the Minister for Industry,
Science and Technology

Customs Act 1901

Public notice under subsection 269ZDB(1B)

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed a review of measures in respect to certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from Malaysia by Alumac Industries Sdn Bhd.

Copies of the applications and various submissions made in relation to the reviews are available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The Commissioner provided his final report and recommendations to me on 3 May 2019. Subsection 269ZDB(1A)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) requires the relevant Minister to make their declaration on the outcome of this investigation within 30 days after receiving the Commissioner's report, that is, by **3 June 2019**.¹

Where there are special circumstances that prevent the declaration being made within that period, subsection 269ZDB(1A)(b) of the Act provides that the declaration may be within such longer period as the Minister considers appropriate.

I consider there are special circumstances due to the complexity of the reviews and that it is appropriate under subsection 269ZDB(1A)(b) of the Act to extend the period for making my declaration for a further **15 days** to **17 June 2019** in order to properly consider the Commissioner's final report and recommendations.
