



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2019/101

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

Resealable can end closures Exported from the Republic of the Philippines

Findings in Relation to a Review of Anti-Dumping Measures

Notice under subsection 269ZDB(1) of the Customs Act 1901

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission has completed a review of the anti-dumping measures applying to certain resealable can end closures (the goods) exported to Australia from the Republic of the Philippines (the Philippines) by Genpacco Inc. (Genpacco). The anti-dumping measures are in the form of a dumping duty notice.

Recommendations resulting from the review, reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the review are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 496* (REP 496).

I, KAREN ANDREWS, the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology have considered REP 496 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all the material findings of facts and law set out in REP 496.

Under subsections 269ZDB(1)(a)(iii) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I declare that, for the purposes of the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975*, with effect from the date of this declaration, that the dumping duty notice currently applying to the goods exported to Australia from the Philippines, by Genpacco is to be taken to have effect as if different variable factors had been fixed, relevant to the determination of duty effective from the date of publication of this notice.

The duty that has been determined is an amount worked out in accordance with the *ad valorem* duty method as detailed in the table below.

The actual duty liability may be higher than the effective rate of duty due to a number of factors. Set out in Table 1 are amounts I have ascertained are the revised normal value, export price and non-injurious price of the goods exported to Australia from the Philippines by Genpacco. To preserve confidentiality, details of the revised variable factors will not be published.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel (www.industry.gov.au) in accordance with the requirements in Division 9 of Part XVB of the Act, within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
