**Aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from China by
Guangdong Huachang Aluminium Factory Co., Ltd – Review No. 497**

Dear [contact]

I refer to Guangdong Huachang Aluminium Factory Co., Ltd's (Huachang) response to the exporter questionnaire received on 7 March 2019 as well as two responses to deficiency advice letters received on 9 April 2019 and 22 July 2019 respectively in relation to Review No. 497.

The Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) has assessed whether Huachang's responses are sufficient. The Commission has identified material deficiencies which remain. These deficiencies are outlined at **Confidential Attachment A**.

Pursuant to subsection 6(b) of the *Customs (Extensions of Time and Non-cooperation) Direction 2015*, I consider that Huachang's responses contain deficiencies that could not, in my view, be quickly and easily rectified in a further response.

In this instance, I consider that:

- the nature and scope of the deficiencies that remain are extensive. I am not satisfied that certain key information is accurate and reliable. As a result, the Commission has been unable to reliably determine individual variable factors (including dumping and subsidy margins) for Huachang based on the information it has provided; and
- based on Huachang's responses to date, additional time to provide a further response would significantly impede the proper conduct of this case in a timely and efficient manner, noting that further verification is likely to be necessary.

PUBLIC RECORD

On the basis of the above, for the purposes of Review No. 497, the Commission may rely on all relevant information available in making recommendations and findings in relation to this review.
