



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2019/91

Aluminum extrusions

Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No. 497

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 15 January 2019, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice, in respect of aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China). The review is limited to examining whether the variable factors relevant to the taking of the anti-dumping measures as they affect Guangdong Huachang Aluminium Factory Co., Ltd (Huachang) from China should be varied.

A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2019/06 (initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at www.industry.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on or before 6 May 2019.¹ The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 19 June 2019.

On 16 April 2019, ADN No. 2019/52 advised that an extension of time had been granted such that the deadline for publishing the SEF was extended to 5 July 2019 and the recommendations to the Minister was extended to 19 August 2019.

The Commission is currently in the process of verifying data and information obtained from the applicant. The Commission requires further time to consider this information and to ensure the findings of this review are accurate. I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and

recommendation to the Minister.²

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act),³ extended the deadline to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister. The SEF will now be placed on the public record on or before **6 September 2019**. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **21 October 2019**.
