Power transformers exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China

Notification of an extension of time to issue the Final Report

On 8 October 2021, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published Statement of Essential Facts No 507A (SEF 507A) which resumed the investigation into power transformers exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.¹ SEF 507A followed the Anti-Dumping Review Panel's (ADRP) revocation of the Commissioner's decision to terminate the investigation, as explained in ADRP Decision Nos 122 and 123.²

In SEF 507A, the Commissioner outlined his intention to provide a final report and recommendations to the Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction in relation to the investigation on or before 22 November 2021, unless the Commissioner terminates the investigation earlier or requires further time to consider submissions to SEF 507A.

The Anti-Dumping Commission notes that the applicant for the investigation, Wilson Transformer Company Pty Ltd (WTC), who provided a submission to SEF 507A, has appealed aspects of ADRP Decisions Nos 122 and 123 to the Full Federal Court. The Full Federal Court has scheduled the hearing for those matters on 17 November 2021.³ The Commissioner considers that a judgement from the hearing may be relevant to the investigation, subject to timing.

Accordingly, the Commissioner is extending the time to complete the investigation and now intends to provide a final report and recommendations to the Minister on or before **24 March 2022**.
