Further extension of time granted to issue the Final Report in relation to Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No 509

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB¹

On 26 April 2019, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice, in respect of aluminium extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from Malaysia by EverPress Aluminium Industries (EverPress).

A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2019/59 (initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (the Commission's) website at www.adcommission.gov.au

On 21 October 2019 the Commission published a statement of essential facts (SEF). In the SEF, and consistent with ADN 2019/114², the Commission advised that the Commissioner would give the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Technology (the Minister) a final report containing his recommendation, on or before 3 December 2019.

I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension to the time period by which to provide the Minister with the final report and recommendations in relation to this review. Specifically, I made a written request to the Commissioner for an extension under subsection 269ZHI(1)(e), of the time period referred to in subsection 269ZDA(1) of the Act.³

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act⁴, further extended the

time period for providing his final report and recommendation to the Minister.⁵

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **17 January 2020**.
