ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2019/103

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

Certain Aluminium Extrusions

Exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China by

Foshan Minghua Doors & Windows Aluminium Co., Ltd

Findings in relation to an Accelerated Review 514 of Anti-Dumping Measures

Notice under subsection 269ZG(3) of the Customs Act 1901¹

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed the accelerated review, which commenced on 13 May 2019, of the anti-dumping measures applying to certain aluminium extrusions (‘the goods’) exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China by Foshan Minghua Doors & Windows Aluminium Co., Ltd (‘the applicant’).

Recommendations resulting from that review, reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the review are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 514* (REP 514).

I, KAREN ANDREWS, the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, have considered REP 514 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all the material findings of facts and law set out in REP 514.

Under subsection 269ZG(3) of the Act I declare that, for the purposes of the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act) with effect from 13 May 2019, the dumping duty notice and countervailing duty notice currently applying to the goods exported to Australia from China is taken to have effect as if the original dumping duty notice and countervailing duty notice had applied to the applicant but that I had fixed specified different variable factors relevant to the determination of duty in respect of the applicant.

The duty that has been determined is an amount worked out in accordance with the combination of fixed and variable duty method as detailed in the table below.

Foshan Minghua Doors & Windows Aluminium Co., Ltd (China)	21.0%	0%	21.0%	Combination of fixed and variable duty method

The actual duty liability may be higher than the effective rate of duty due to a number of factors.
