# HIGH DENSITY POLYETHYLENE EXPORTED FROM THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA, THE REPUBLIC OF SINGAPORE, THE KINGDOM OF THAILAND AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

## NOTE FOR FILE: IMPORTER COOPERATION

**13 AUGUST 2019**

On 24 June 2019, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission initiated an investigation (number 515) into the alleged dumping of high density polyethylene (HDPE) exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea, the Republic of Singapore, the Kingdom of Thailand and the United States of America.

As part of the investigation, certain importers of HDPE were invited by the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commission) to complete importer questionnaires, which were to be sent to the Commission according to the below:

- Part A was due no later than 1 July 2019 (unless extended)
- Parts B and C were due no later 15 July 2019 (unless extended)

The following importers of HDPE have provided the Commission with adequate responses to the importer questionnaire in relation to investigation 515, pursuant to the *Customs (Extensions of Time and Non-cooperation) Direction 2015*:<sup>1</sup>
