



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2020/129

Resealable can end closures Exported from Malaysia by Federal Metal Printing Factory Sdn Bhd

Extension of time granted to issue the Final Report in relation to Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No 527

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 1 October 2019, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice, in respect of resealable can end closures (the goods) exported to Australia from Malaysia by Federal Metal Printing Factory Sdn Bhd (Federal Metal), an exporter of the goods.

A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2019/122 (initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on or before 19 January 2020. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 4 March 2020.

As outlined in ADN No. 2020/106, the Commissioner has previously extended these deadlines. As a result of the extension described in ADN No. 2020/106, a recommendation to the Minister was due on or before 13 November 2020.

The Commission has received two submissions in response to the SEF published on 29 September 2020. These submissions raise issues regarding determination of the normal value and non-injurious price. To allow time to properly consider these submissions, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission, requested a further extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.¹

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,² extended the deadline to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **20 November 2020**.
