ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2020/004

Hot rolled coil steel exported from Taiwan

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to a Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No. 528

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 18 October 2019, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice, in respect of hot rolled coil steel (the goods) exported to Australia from Taiwan as they affect exporters of those goods generally. A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2019/128 (initiation notice).

The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on or before 5 February 2020. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 23 March 2020.¹

Due to delays in the Commission's verification activities, I, Matthew Williams, (A/g) General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.²

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation.³ The SEF will now be placed on the public record on or before **5 May 2020**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **19 June 2020**.
