## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2020/92**

### **Hot rolled coil exported from Taiwan**

### **Findings in relation to a Review of anti-dumping measures**

#### **Notice under section 269ZDB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901***

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed a review, which commenced on 25 September 2019, of the anti-dumping measures applying to hot rolled coil steel exported to Australia from Taiwan. The anti-dumping measures are in the form of a dumping duty notice.

Recommendations resulting from the review, reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the review are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 528 (REP 528)*.

I, KAREN ANDREWS, the Minister for Industry, Science, and Technology have considered REP 528 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all the material findings of facts or law set out in REP 528.

Under section 269ZDB(1)(a)(iii) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I DECLARE that, for the purposes of the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act), with effect from the day after the publication of this notice, the dumping duty notice is to be taken to have effect in relation to China Steel Corporation, Shang Chen Steel Co., Ltd, Chung Hung Steel Corporation and exporters generally, as if different variable factors had been fixed in respect of those exporters, relevant to the determination of duty.

The non-injurious price of goods of that kind as last ascertained for the purposes of the dumping duty notice is less than the normal value of goods of that kind last so ascertained. Accordingly, pursuant to section 8(5B) of the Dumping Duty Act, I have had regard to the desirability of specifying a lesser amount of duty and have fixed the interim duty to be such a sum so that:

- (i) the export price of goods of that kind last so ascertained; and
- (ii) that lesser duty,

does not exceed that non-injurious price of goods of that kind as ascertained.

To preserve confidentiality, details of the revised variable factors, being the ascertained export price, ascertained normal value and non-injurious price, will not be published. Particulars of the dumping margins established for each of the exporters and the effective rates of duty are also set out in the following table.

Taiwan	China Steel Corporation	-5.0%	0%	Floor price duty method
	Chung Hung Steel Corporation	-8.9%	0%	Floor price duty method
	Shang Chen Steel Co., Ltd	-3.2%	0%	Floor price duty method
	Uncooperative and all other exporters	-0.2%	0%	Floor price duty method

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel ([www.adreviewpanel.gov.au](http://www.adreviewpanel.gov.au)), in accordance with the requirements in Division 9 of Part XVB of the Act, within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
