Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

Certain grinding balls

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Findings in relation to an Accelerated Review No. 533 of Anti-Dumping Measures

Public Notice under subsection 269ZG(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed the accelerated review, which commenced on 31 October 2019, of the anti-dumping measures applying to certain grinding balls exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China by Growth Steel Grinding Ball (Suzhou) Co., Ltd.

Recommendations resulting from that review, reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the accelerated review are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 533 (REP 533)*.

I, KAREN ANDREWS, the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, have considered REP 533 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all the material findings of facts and law, set out in REP 533.

Under subsection 269ZG(3) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I declare that, for the purposes of the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act), the original dumping duty notice and countervailing duty notice is to remain unchanged.

Growth Steel Grinding Ball (Suzhou) Co., Ltd may apply again for an accelerated review under section 269ZE of the Act.
