Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

PVC flat electric cables

Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China

Findings in relation to an Accelerated Review No. 536 of Anti-Dumping Measures

Public Notice under subsection 269ZG(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission has completed the accelerated review, which commenced on 27 November 2019, of the anti-dumping measures applying to PVC flat electric cables exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China by Hebei Huatong Wires and Cables Group Co., Ltd (Hebei Huatong).

Recommendations resulting from that review, reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the accelerated review are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 536 (REP 536)*.

I, KAREN ANDREWS, the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, have considered REP 536 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all the material findings of facts and law, set out in REP 536.

Under subsection 269ZG(3) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I declare that, for the purposes of the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975*, the dumping duty notice and countervailing duty notice is to remain unchanged.

Hebei Huatong may apply again for an accelerated review under section 269ZE of the Act.
