**Extension of time granted for the Final Report
in relation to Investigation No. 540**

On 24 February 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of mill finish aluminium extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from Malaysia by Press Metal Sdn Bhd, Milleon Extruder Sdn Bhd, LB Aluminium Sdn Bhd, Kamco Aluminium Sdn Bhd, Superb Aluminium Industries Sdn Bhd, and Genesis Aluminium Industries Sdn Bhd. A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/18 (the initiation notice).

The initiation notice stated a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 28 July 2020.

The Commissioner previously extended this deadline so relevantly a report containing a recommendation to the Minister is currently due on or before 23 February 2021.¹

To provide further time to consider the submissions received in response to the publication of *Statement of Essential Facts No. 540* on 9 December 2020, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to provide a final report and recommendation to the Minister.²

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the deadline to provide the final report and recommendation to the Minister.³ A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, **31 March 2021**.
