ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2021/034

Aluminium Extrusions (Mill Finish)

Exported to Australia from Malaysia

Termination of part of Investigation No. 540

Public notice under section 269TDA(15) of the *Customs Act 1901*

On 24 February 2020, Mr Dale Seymour, the Commissioner¹ of the Anti-Dumping Commission, initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping of mill finish aluminium extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from Malaysia, following an application lodged by Capral Limited under subsection 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

Public notice of the then Commissioner's decision to not reject the application and to initiate the investigation was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website on 24 February 2020. The ADN is available at: www.adcommission.gov.au

As a result of the Commission's investigation, I, Dr Bradley Armstrong PSM, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission am satisfied that:

- in relation to Superb Aluminium Industries Sdn Bhd, some of the goods exported by that exporter have been dumped, but the overall dumping margin is less than two per cent; and
- therefore, I have terminated the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(1)(a)(ii) of the Act, in so far as it relates to Superb Aluminium Industries Sdn Bhd.

In making the decision to terminate part of this investigation, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties, *Statement of Essential Facts No. 540* (SEF 540), submissions in response to SEF 540, *Termination Report No. 540* and other relevant information.

¹ On 10 February 2021, the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology appointed Dr Bradley Armstrong PSM as the Anti-Dumping Commissioner. Mr Dale Seymour finished his position as Commissioner on 18 February 2021.

Termination Report No. 540, which sets out reasons for the termination decision, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decision is based, has been placed on the Commission's public record at: www.adcommission.gov.au.

The findings and recommendations relating to the investigation into the alleged dumping of the goods from Malaysia were provided in a report to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology on 29 April 2021.

The applicant may request a review of this decision to terminate the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
