## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2020/058**

**Aluminium micro-extrusions exported to Australia  
from the People's Republic of China**

**by Guangdong Jiangsheng Aluminium Co Ltd  
and Guangdong Zhongya Aluminium Co Ltd**

**Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts  
and the Final Report in relation to an investigation No. 542**

On 17 February 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of aluminium micro-extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China by Guangdong Jiangsheng Aluminium Co Ltd and Guangdong Zhongya Aluminium Co Ltd. A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/13 (the initiation notice).

The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commission) website at: [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au)

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on, or before, 6 June 2020. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on, or before, 21 July 2020.

Due to the current global COVID-19 pandemic and the reduced availability of relevant staff, the relevant exporters requested, and were granted, additional time to provide a complete response to the exporter questionnaire. These responses have now been received, and the the Commission is examining whether the goods exported to Australia were at dumped prices.

As a result, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.<sup>1</sup>

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide the final report and recommendation.<sup>2</sup> The SEF will now be placed on the public record on, or before, **4 October 2020**.<sup>3</sup>

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, **18 November 2020**.
