ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2020/110

**Aluminium micro-extrusions exported to Australia
from the People's Republic of China**

**by Guangdong Jiangsheng Aluminium Co Ltd
and Guangdong Zhongya Aluminium Co Ltd**

**Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts
and the Final Report in relation to Investigation No. 542**

On 17 February 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of aluminium micro-extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China by Guangdong Jiangsheng Aluminium Co Ltd and Guangdong Zhongya Aluminium Co Ltd. A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/13 (the initiation notice).

The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commission) website at: www.adcommission.gov.au

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on, or before, 6 June 2020. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on, or before, 21 July 2020.

As advised in ADN No. 2020/58,¹ the Commissioner has previously extended these deadlines. The SEF is currently due to be placed on the public record on or before 4 October 2020,² and a recommendation provided to the Minister in a report on, or before 18 November 2020.

Due to the current ongoing global COVID-19 pandemic and the reduced availability of relevant staff, in conjunction with additional delays that have occurred in undertaking the Commission's verification activities, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested a further extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.³

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide the final report and recommendation.⁴ The SEF will now be placed on the public record on, or before, **1 February 2021**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, **18 March 2021**.
