## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2021/009**

**Aluminium micro-extrusions exported to Australia  
from the People's Republic of China**

**by Guangdong Jiangsheng Aluminium Co Ltd  
and Guangdong Zhongya Aluminium Co Ltd**

**Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts  
and the Final Report in relation to Investigation No. 542**

On 17 February 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of aluminium micro-extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China by Guangdong Jiangsheng Aluminium Co Ltd and Guangdong Zhongya Aluminium Co Ltd.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/013 (the initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commission) website at: [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au)

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on, or before, 6 June 2020. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on, or before, 21 July 2020.

As advised in ADN Nos. 2020/058 and 2020/110, the Commissioner has previously extended these deadlines.<sup>1</sup> The SEF is currently due to be placed on the public record on or before, 1 February 2021, and a recommendation provided to the Minister in a report on, or before, 18 March 2021.

Due to the ongoing global COVID-19 pandemic and additional further delays that have occurred in undertaking the Commission's verification activities, I, Justin Wickes, Acting General Manager, Investigations of the Commission, requested a further extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.<sup>2</sup>

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide the final report and recommendation.<sup>3</sup> The SEF will now be placed on the public record on, or before, **18 March 2021**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF, within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, **2 May 2021**.<sup>4</sup>
