



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2020/056

Aluminium extrusions exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to a Continuation Inquiry into Anti-Dumping Measures No. 543

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 13 February 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a continuation inquiry (the inquiry) into the anti-dumping measures applying to aluminium extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China). A full description of the goods and the current anti-dumping measures is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/017 (initiation notice).

The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on or before 2 June 2020. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 17 July 2020.

The Covid-19 pandemic has meant that the Commission has presently ceased international on-site verification.¹ This has, in turn, caused consequential delays in the Commission's verification activities. As a result, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.²

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation.³ The SEF will now be placed on the public record on or before **17 July 2020**.
