ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2021/045

Aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

Extension of time granted to issue the Final Report in relation to Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No. 544

On 24 February 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of the anti-dumping measures applying to certain aluminium extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam (Vietnam). The anti-dumping measures are in the form of a dumping duty notice (Malaysia and Vietnam) and a countervailing duty notice (Malaysia only).¹

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/014 (initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commission) website at: www.adcommission.gov.au

The initiation notice stated a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 28 July 2020.

The Commissioner previously extended this deadline so relevantly a report containing a recommendation to the Minister is currently due on or before 31 March 2021.²

To allow the Commission to consider matters further, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to provide a final report and recommendation to the Minister.³

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to provide the final report and recommendation.⁴ A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, **29 April 2021**.
