



Anti-Dumping Review Panel Review No. 130

Steel Reinforcing Bar

Exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea, Singapore, Spain (except Nervacero S.A.) and Taiwan (except Power Steel Co., Ltd)

FILE NOTE

On 6 November 2020, the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) accepted by signed notice¹, the recommendations of the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) in relation to the continuation inquiry of anti-dumping measures applying to steel reinforcing bar exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea (Korea), Singapore, Spain (except Nervacero S.A.) and Taiwan (except Power Steel Co., Ltd). The findings and recommendations from the continuation inquiry are set out in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 546* (REP 546).²

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) is conducting a review³ of the Minister's decision under section 269ZHG(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act)⁴, having received applications for review from the following interested parties:

- Compañia Española de Laminación, S.L. (CELSA)⁵; and
- InfraBuild (Newcastle) Pty Ltd (InfraBuild).⁶

Pursuant to section 269ZZL of the Act, the ADRP requires the following findings in REP 546, which concern InfraBuild's grounds for review, to be reinvestigated:

- the normal value for the Korean exporter, Daehan Steel Co., Ltd (Daehan);
- the normal value for uncooperative and other Korean exporters; and
- whether the expiration of the measures in respect of Daehan and uncooperative and other exporters from Korea would lead, or likely to lead, to the material injury that the anti-dumping measure is intended to prevent.⁷

The Commissioner is to report to the ADRP on the findings of the reinvestigation by **7 April 2021**.
