**Extension of time granted to issue the
Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report
in relation to Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No. 551**

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 16 April 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of the anti-dumping measures applying to A4 copy paper (the goods) exported to Australia from the Federative Republic of Brazil, the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Indonesia (except by PT. Indah Kiat Pulp & Paper Tbk, PT. Pabrik Kertas Tjiwi Kimia Tbk and PT. Pindo Deli Pulp & Paper Mills) and the Kingdom of Thailand.

A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/039 (initiation notice).

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on or before 4 August 2020. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 18 September 2020.

The Commissioner previously approved my requests for an extension to the time periods for publishing the SEF and providing the final report and recommendation to the Minister.¹ Due to delays in completing the remote exporter verifications, and in order to fully consider issues raised by interested parties in this review, Justin Wickes, Acting General Manager, Investigations, requested a further extension to those time periods.²

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,³ approved the request for a further extension.⁴

The SEF will now be placed on the public record on or before **12 March 2021**. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **26 April 2021**.
