Extension of time granted to issue the Final Report in relation to Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No. 551

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 16 April 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of the anti-dumping measures applying to A4 copy paper (the goods) exported to Australia from the Federative Republic of Brazil, the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Indonesia (except by PT. Indah Kiat Pulp & Paper Tbk, PT. Pabrik Kertas Tjiwi Kimia Tbk and PT. Pindo Deli Pulp & Paper Mills) and the Kingdom of Thailand. A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/039 (initiation notice).

The Commissioner has previously approved extensions to the time periods for publishing the statement of essential facts (SEF) and providing the final report and recommendation to the Minister.¹ The SEF was published on the public record on 26 March 2021.

A further extension to the time period for providing the final report and recommendation to the Minister has been requested.² The extension was requested so that submissions made by interested parties in response to the SEF and received up to 14 May 2021 could be fully considered. The extension of time has not been sought to allow further submissions to the review.³

³ In accordance with section 269ZDA(4) of the *Customs Act 1901*, the Commissioner is not obliged to have regard to any submission made in response to the SEF received after the end of the 20 day period for submissions (being, 15 April 2021), if to do so would, in the Commissioner's opinion, prevent the timely preparation of the report to the Minister.

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,⁴ approved the request for a further extension.⁵ A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **7 June 2021**.
