



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2020/091

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to Anti-Circumvention Inquiry No. 552

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 28 April 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an anti-circumvention inquiry in relation to certain A4 copy paper exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.

A description of the alleged circumvention goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/045 (initiation notice).

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on or before 16 August 2020. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 30 September 2020.

Due to delays in finalising verification activities and in order to fully consider information provided by interested parties, I, Nathan Zhivov, General Manager, Economic and Strategic Services, requested, under sections 269ZHI(1)(ea) and (eb) of the *Customs Act 1901* ('the Act'), an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.¹

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act,² extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.

The SEF will now be placed on the public record on or before **24 November 2020**. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **8 January 2021**.
