



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2021/026

Certain copper tube

Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China and Republic of Korea

Investigation No. 557 into Alleged Dumping and Subsidisation

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report

Customs Act 1901 (Cth) – Part XVB

On 13 July 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of copper tube (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China, and the alleged dumping of the goods exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/071 available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au (initiation notice).

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record by 2 November 2020.¹ The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister would be made in a final report on, or before, 15 December 2020. As advised in ADN No. 2020/124, the Commissioner has previously extended this deadline. The SEF is currently due to be placed on the public record on or before 30 March 2021, and a recommendation provided to the Minister in a report on or before 14 May 2021.

The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted interested parties, delaying the provision of their responses to information requests. It has also affected the ability of Commission staff to undertake verification of information within the usual timeframes.

As a result of the delays associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.²

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide the final report and recommendation.³

The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **17 August 2021**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, **20 October 2021**.
