# Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report

Customs Act 1901 (Cth) - Part XVB

On 30 June 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of aluminium zinc coated steel of a width less than 600 millimeters (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/068 available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au (initiation notice).

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record by 19 October 2020. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on, or before, 2 December 2020.

As advised in ADN No. 2020/116, the Commissioner has extended these deadlines. Due to the scale of the investigation, the number of countries involved and additional delays in undertaking the Commission's verification activities, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Anti-Dumping Commission requested a further extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide a final report and recommendation to the Minister. <sup>2</sup>

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act, approved my request to extend the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide the final report and recommendation.

The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 3 September 2021.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, **27 October 2021**.
