## ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2021/071

Continuation Inquiry No. 565

Ammonium Nitrate exported to Australia  
from the Russian Federation

Notice for longer period for the declaration of the Minister for  
Industry, Science and Technology

*Customs Act 1901 (Cth)*  
Public notice under section 269ZHG(1B)

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed an inquiry into whether the continuation of anti-dumping measures in respect of ammonium nitrate exported to Australia from the Russian Federation is justified.

The Commissioner provided his final report and recommendations to me on 19 April 2021. Section 269ZHG(1B)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901 (Cth)* (the Act) requires me to make my declaration on the outcome of this inquiry within 30 days after receiving the Commissioner's report, that is, by **19 May 2021**.

Where there are special circumstances that prevent me from making the declaration within that period, section 269ZHG(1B)(b) of the Act provides that the declaration may be within such a longer period as I consider appropriate.

I consider there are special circumstances due to the complexity of the continuation inquiry and that it is appropriate under section 269ZDB(1B)(b) of the Act to extend the period for making my declaration for a further **4 days** to properly consider the Commissioner's final report and recommendations. This means my declaration must now be made by **23 May 2021**.
