



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2021/3

Hollow structural sections exported from the Republic of Korea by HiSteel Co., Ltd

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to a Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No. 567

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 1 October 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of the anti-dumping measures (the review) applying to certain hollow structural sections (the goods) exported to Australia from the Republic of Korea (Korea) by HiSteel Co., Ltd (HiSteel). HiSteel has submitted that the measures applying to its exports of the goods are no longer warranted. A full description of the goods and the current anti-dumping measures is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/109 (initiation notice). The notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) website at: www.adcommission.gov.au

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on, or before, 19 January 2021. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on, or before, 5 March 2021.

As a result of delays in completing the Commission's analysis and preparation of the SEF, I, Justin Wickes, Acting General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.¹

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation.² The SEF will now be placed on the public record on or before **23 February 2021**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, **9 April 2021**.
