Dear Commissioner,

Histeel again confirms that at the time of lodging its application for revocation, it fully intended to participate with the Commission's inquiry and demonstrate that the interim dumping duties were no longer warranted. However, as highlighted in several correspondence with the Commission following initiation, Histeel faced difficulties in preparing information requested in the questionnaire due to unavailability of accounting personnel stemming from XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX and Korea's COVID-19 restrictions.

Histeel continues to contend that the measures are no longer warranted, as supported by the available evidence. This includes:

- Histeel's exports to Australia only commenced in substantial quantities in 2017;
- Its exported goods relate only to one specific model;
- that particular export model includes a substantial volume of products which are not manufactured by the local Australian producers;
- Histeel's exports to Australia have been found to not be dumped in the most recent review, and
- Measures applying to Thai exports have been revoked on the basis of similar grounds.

For these reasons, Histeel believes that there are sufficient grounds to consider that the measures are no longer warranted.
