



CONTINUATION INQUIRY (CASE 569)

CERTAIN GRINDING BALLS EXPORTED TO AUSTRALIA FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

File Note - Extension of time for Questionnaire Responses

On 14 December 2020, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) notified exporters of grinding balls from the People's Republic of China that questionnaire responses in relation to this continuation inquiry were due by no later than 20 January 2021.

The Commission has received requests for extensions of time to the due date from certain exporters within the legislated period, who have communicated their intent to cooperate with the inquiry. Due consideration has been given to the extension requests by the General Manager of the Commission, having regard to the exporters' individual circumstances and the *Customs (Extensions of Time and Non-cooperation) Direction 2015*.¹

The following table summarises the extensions of time given in relation to individual exporters and provides a summary of the revised due dates:
