



## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2021/42**

### **Certain grinding balls exported from the People's Republic of China**

### **Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to Continuation Inquiry no. 569**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

On 14 December 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an inquiry into whether the anti-dumping measures applying to certain grinding balls (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) ought to be continued. A full description of the goods and the current anti-dumping measures is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/146 (initiation notice). The notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) website at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on or before 3 April 2021. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) would be made in a final report on or before 18 May 2021.

As a result of delays in completing the Commission's analysis and preparation of the SEF, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.<sup>1</sup>

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation.<sup>2</sup> The SEF will now be placed on the public record on or before **18 May 2021**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **2 July 2021**.
