



## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2021/080**

### **Certain grinding balls exported from the People's Republic of China**

### **Extension of time granted to issue the Final Report in relation to Continuation Inquiry No. 569**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

On 14 December 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an inquiry into whether the anti-dumping measures applying to certain grinding balls (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) ought to be continued. A full description of the goods and the current anti-dumping measures is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/146 (initiation notice). The notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) website at [www.adcommission.gov.au](http://www.adcommission.gov.au).

The statement of essential facts (SEF) for the continuation inquiry was placed on the public record on 18 May 2021.<sup>1</sup> The due date for submissions in response to the SEF was 7 June 2021.

The Commission received a number of submissions in response to the SEF that raise complex issues which require further consideration. As a result, and in order to finalise this process, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of time under section 269ZHI(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) to the deadline for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.<sup>2</sup>

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act,<sup>3</sup> extended the deadline to provide his final report and recommendations. The Commissioner's recommendation will now be made in a report due on or before 23 July 2021.
