## Reinvestigation of certain findings in relation to Continuation Inquiry No. 573 & 574 relating to Food Service and Industrial Pineapple (FSI) exported from the Republic of the Philippines and the Kingdom of Thailand

### File Note

On 6 October 2021, the then Acting Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (Minister) accepted by signed notice, the recommendations of the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) in relation to the continuation inquiry of anti-dumping measures applying to FSI pineapples exported from the Republic of the Philippines (Philippines) and the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand). The findings and recommendations from the continuation inquiry are set out in Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 573 & 574 (REP 573 & 574).

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) is conducting a review of the Minister's decision under section 269ZHG(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), having received an application for a review from Golden Circle Limited (Golden Circle).

Pursuant to section 269ZZL of the Act, the ADRP has requested the Anti-Dumping Commission (commission) to reinvestigate certain findings in REP 573 & 574. For the purposes of the reinvestigation, the commission invites interested parties to make submissions on the matters related to the findings that the ADRP has requested the commission to reinvestigate.
