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# **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2021/116**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

## **Clear float glass**

**Exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China,  
the Republic of Indonesia and the Kingdom of Thailand**

### **Findings of the Continuation Inquiry No 575**

*Notice under section 269ZHG(1) of the Customs Act 1901*

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed an inquiry, which commenced on 2 February 2021, into whether it is justified to continue the anti-dumping measures applying to clear float glass (the goods) exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China (China), the Republic of Indonesia (Indonesia) and the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand).

Exports of the goods from Xinyi Ultrathin Glass (Dongguan) Co Ltd are not covered by this inquiry, as the measures currently in place in relation to the goods do not apply to that company’s exports of the goods.

Recommendations resulting from the inquiry, reasons for the recommendations, and material findings of fact and law in relation to the inquiry are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 575 (REP 575)*.

I, ANGUS TAYLOR, the Acting Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, have considered Report 575 and have decided to accept the recommendation and reasons for the recommendation, including all the material findings of facts and law therein.

Under section 269ZHG(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (Cth) (the Act),<sup>1</sup> I declare that I have decided not to secure the continuation of the anti-dumping measures applying to exports of the goods from China and Thailand.

Under section 269ZHG(1)(b) of the Act, I declare that I have decided to secure the continuation of the anti-dumping measures currently applying to the goods exported to Australia from Indonesia.

Having decided to secure the continuation of the anti-dumping measures currently applying to the goods exported to Australia from Indonesia, I determine:

- pursuant to section 269ZHG(4)(a)(ii) of the Act, that the notice continue in force after 17 October 2021 but that, after this day, the notice cease to apply in relation to PT Muliaglass from Indonesia and
- pursuant to section 269ZHG(4)(a)(iii) of the Act, that the notice continues in force after 17 October 2021 but that, after this day, has effect as if different specified variable factors had been fixed in relation to PT Asahimas Flat Glass Tbk.

Particulars of the rates of interim dumping duty for exporters from Indonesia are set out below.

PT Muliaglass	N/A	N/A
PT Asahimas Flat Glass Tbk	15.3%	<i>ad valorem</i>
All other exporters	28.3%	<i>ad valorem</i>
