ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2022/077

Quenched and tempered steel plate

Exported to Australia from the United States of America

Termination of Investigation No 578

Public notice under section 269TDA(15) of the *Customs Act 1901*

On 15 March 2021, I, Dr Bradley Armstrong PSM, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (commission), initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping of quenched and tempered steel plate (Q&T steel plate, the goods) exported to Australia from the United States of America (USA).

I initiated the investigation following an application from Bisalloy Steels Pty Ltd under section 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

The commission published a public notice (initiation notice) of my decision to initiate the investigation on the commission's website on 15 March 2021. The initiation notice is available on the public record for this case at www.adcommission.gov.au.

As a result of the commission's investigation I am satisfied that:

- For the goods that SSAB Alabama Inc. (SSAB Alabama) exported to Australia, the dumping margin was negligible at **1.7%**. Therefore, the investigation must be terminated in accordance with subsection 269TDA(1)(b)(ii) in so far as it relates to this exporter.
- SSAB Alabama was the sole exporter of the goods from the USA to Australia during the investigation period. Accordingly, the termination of the investigation against SSAB Alabama brings this investigation as a whole to a close.

Therefore, I have terminated the investigation in accordance with section 269TDA(1)(b)(ii) of the Act.

In making the decision to terminate the investigation, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties, *Statement of Essential Facts No 578* (SEF 578) and submissions and further information provided to the commission in response to SEF 578.

Termination Report No 578, which sets out the reasons for my decision, including the material findings of fact and law upon which the decision is based, has been placed on the commission's public record.

The applicant may request a review of my decision to terminate the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
