## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2022/027**

### **Clear Float Glass**

### **Exported to Australia from Malaysia and the United Arab Emirates**

### **Extension of time granted to issue the Final Report in relation to Investigation No 582**

*Customs Act 1901 (Cth) – Part XVB*

On 27 April 2021, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice (initiation notice)<sup>1</sup> announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of clear float glass (CFG, the goods)<sup>2</sup> exported to Australia from Malaysia and the United Arab Emirates (UAE), and the alleged subsidisation of the goods exported to Australia from Malaysia.<sup>3</sup>

The initiation notice advised that the Commissioner would publish a statement of essential facts (SEF) on the public record by 16 August 2021. The initiation notice also advised that the Commissioner would make a recommendation to the then Minister for Industry, Science and Technology in a final report on, or before, 29 September 2021.

As advised in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) Nos 2021/105, 2021/143, and 2022/020, the Commissioner extended the due dates to publish the SEF and provide the final report to the Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction (the Minister). The Anti-Dumping Commission (the commission) published the SEF on the public record on 14 December 2021. The Commissioner was due to make a recommendation to the Minister in a report on, or before, 11 March 2022.

To allow the commission to consider recent submissions made by interested parties to the SEF,<sup>4</sup> Isolde Lueckenhausen, General Manager of the commission, requested a further extension of the due date for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.

The Commissioner is now due to provide his final report to the Minister on, or before, **8 April 2022**. The Commissioner is not inviting further submissions by granting this extension.<sup>5</sup>
