ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2022/062

Investigation No 583 into Alleged Dumping of Certain A4 Copy Paper Exported to Australia from the Republic of Indonesia by PT. Pabrik Kertas Tjiwi Kimia Tbk

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 2 June 2021, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published an initiation notice for an investigation into the alleged dumping of certain A4 copy paper (the goods) exported to Australia from the Republic of Indonesia (Indonesia).

A full description of the goods and the basis for the initiation is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2021/072. This ADN is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The ADN advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record by 20 September 2021. The ADN also advised that the SEF would set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposed to base his recommendations to the then Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the then Minister) in relation to this investigation. The ADN advised that a recommendation to the then Minister would be made in a final report on or before 4 November 2021.

The Commissioner previously approved requests for an extension of time to publish the SEF and provide the final report and recommendation to the then Minister.¹

Due to the commission's ongoing business requirements, I, Rhys Piper, Acting Deputy Commissioner, Anti-Dumping Commission, have requested a further extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Minister).²

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,³ extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation.

The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 29 July 2022. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, 26 September 2022.
