



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2022/043

Investigation No 584

Alleged dumping of certain merchant bar

Exported to Australia from Taiwan

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of essential facts and final report

Customs Act 1901 (Cth) – Part XV B

On 31 May 2021, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice (initiation notice) announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of certain merchant bar (the goods) exported to Australia from Taiwan.¹

The initiation notice advised that the Commissioner would publish a statement of essential facts (SEF) on the public record by 20 September 2021. The initiation notice also advised that the Commissioner's recommendations would be made in a final report on, or before, 3 November 2021.

As advised in previously published Anti-Dumping Notices (ADNs), the Commissioner extended the due dates to publish the SEF and provide the final report to the Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction (the Minister). The Commissioner was due to publish a SEF on the public record no later than 13 May 2022. The Commissioner was also due to make a recommendation to the Minister in a final report on, or before, 28 June 2022.

As a consequence of operational considerations and to allow time for the commission to finalise the SEF, I, Isolde Lueckenhausen, General Manager (Investigations), requested a further extension of the due date for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.²

The Acting Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), extended the due date to publish the SEF and provide the final report and

recommendation to the Minister.³

The Commissioner is now due to publish a SEF on the public record no later than 20 May 2022. The Commissioner is now due to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister on, or before, 5 July 2022.

The Acting Commissioner is not inviting further submissions at this time by granting this extension.⁴ The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the Minister. Upon publication of the SEF on the public record, interested parties have 20 days to send submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF.
