## Investigation No 584 into the alleged dumping of certain Merchant Bar Exported from Taiwan

### File note

On 20 May 2022, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the commission) published Statement of Essential Facts No 584 (SEF 584) in relation to the investigation into merchant bar exported from Taiwan. The commission informed interested parties that submissions in response to SEF 584 should be received no later than 9 June 2022.

The commission received a request for an extension of time to respond to SEF 584. Due consideration has been given to this request by the general manager, having regard to the individual circumstances of this interested party, the circumstances of the case and the *Customs (Extensions of Time and Non-cooperation) Direction 2015*.<sup>1</sup>

The general manager has decided to grant an extension to all interested parties to respond to SEF 584. Interested parties should now provide submissions no later than **16 June 2022**. The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) is not obliged to have regard to any submission received after this date if to do so would, in the opinion of the Commissioner, prevent the timely preparation of the final report to the Minister.

Unless this investigation is terminated earlier, the Commissioner must report to the Minister on, or before, **5 July 2022**.
