Investigation No. 588 – OAP response to SEF 588 published on 17 December 2021

Opal Australian Paper (“OAP”) welcomes the proposed recommendations to the Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction (“the Minister”) contained in Statement of Essential Facts No. 588 (“SEF 588”) that steps should be taken to secure the continuation of the dumping duty notice applicable to the goods exported from Brazil, China, Indonesia and Thailand.

OAP notes for the record its support the Commissioner’s preliminary recommendation that steps be taken to secure the continuation of the countervailing duty notice applicable to the goods exported from China.

OAP expresses its agreement with the Commission’s preliminary findings and recommendation to the Minister that the variable factors for the dumping duty notice in relation to exports by RAK from Indonesia and all other subject exporters from Indonesia should be altered.

OAP commends the diligent work undertaken by the Commission in relation to this continuation inquiry and awaits the publication of the Commissioner’s Final Report to the Minister in line within the legislated timeframes.
