



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2022/015

Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts in relation to Continuation No. 591

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 15 September 2021, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an inquiry. The inquiry relates to whether the anti-dumping measures in respect of aluminium extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, should continue.

The notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record by 4 January 2022.¹ The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction (the Minister) in relation to this inquiry.

The notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister would be made in a final report on, or before, 17 February 2022.

The Commissioner previously approved an extension of time to publish the SEF and issue the final report to the Minister².

A further extension of time is required to complete the commission's analysis and verification activities and publish the SEF.

An extension was not sought to extend the deadline to issue the final report to the Minister. Therefore a recommendation to the Minister will be made in a report due on, or before, **13 May 2022**.³

For this reason, I, Isolde Lueckenhausen, General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an additional extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF.⁴

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline to publish the SEF.⁵

The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **18 March 2022**. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.
